Compassionate Care Fund

Donor support for the Compassionate Care Fund at Nemours Children's Hospital in Delaware has had a profound impact on the lives of many children and their families.

Financial Assistance for Families: Donations may cover costs for transportation, food, diapers, car seats, uninsured prostheses, and medical devices. This support is vital for families who might otherwise struggle to afford these necessities.

Health Equity: Philanthropic contributions have enabled Nemours to address social determinants of health through innovative programs. These include mobile medical vans for health screenings, initiatives to combat food insecurity, and community health fairs.

Delaware News

We are excited to announce several significant investments in our Delaware campus, including plans for a groundbreaking Maternal and Fetal Health Program, expansion of our neonatology, cancer and cardiology programs, and the revitalization of the historic Institute building on the Alfred I. duPont Campus in Wilmington.

New Maternal and Fetal Health Program

Nemours will expand its Advanced Delivery Program at Nemours Children's Hospital, Delaware into a nationally leading, state-of-the-art Maternal and Fetal Health Program, including four new labor and delivery birthing suites, eight new antepartum and postpartum rooms and three operating rooms that can be used for both fetal and maternal care.

Growth in Neonatology, Cancer and Cardiology programs

In Neonatology, Delaware's only Level IV Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) will be expanding this year, adding 14 new inpatient rooms. With this expansion, the NICU will house 45 beds as a contiguous unit.

Revitalization of Historic duPont Institute Building

Nemours will continue to revitalize the original Alfred I. duPont Institute on our Wilmington campus as a state-of-the-art administrative office building, while paying homage to our origin as the founding A.I. duPont Institute. The Institute opened in 1940 as a children's orthopedic hospital and was the original health care structure funded by the Nemours Foundation. To be completed mid-2026, the project includes an expanded, state-of-the-art **Simulation Center** to provide hands-on, interactive pediatric simulation experiences in a safe, realistic environment. This collaborative teaching and education enhance technical skills for care providers across the organization, improving the quality of care and leading to better outcomes.

Ellen's Story

"We barely had time to process what was happening."

Ellen loves basketball, camping, horseback riding, and dancing. But 5 years ago, she received a diagnosis that would turn her family's world upside down.

Ellen's mom, Trish, is a nurse, and knew something wasn't right with her daughter. But after many trips to the doctor, Ellen's lab work kept coming back normal.

On one doctor visit, the pediatrician heard something when listening to Ellen's heart. He told the family to get Ellen to the Emergency Department at Nemours Children's Hospital, Delaware as soon as possible. A team at Nemours was ready and it wasn't long before Ellen was admitted to the Cardiac Intensive Care Unit. Ellen was in severe heart failure.

Ellen was diagnosed with dilated cardiomyopathy, a condition in which the heart muscle becomes weakened and enlarged and, as a result, it cannot pump enough blood to the rest of the body. Further testing revealed Ellen was born with a genetic mutation in her heart.

"We barely had time to process what was happening," says Trish. "We learned in a matter of hours our daughter is in heart failure and needs a transplant. Then, just 19 days later, we learned there was a heart available." Ellen received a transplant at Nemours, performed by Nemours Chief of Cardiothoracic Surgery Dr. Christian Pizarro.

While the transplant was successful, Ellen was treated for rejection. A follow up echocardiogram (echo), also revealed a large mass on Ellen's heart. She was diagnosed with a large atrial thrombus, which is a blood clot that develops and can obstruct or stop the flow of blood, or even possibly travel inside her body to cause a stroke.

In her second open-heart surgery in less than three months, Nemours cardiothoracic surgeon Dr. Glenn Pelletier removed the mass.

After a year of recovery, Ellen returned to school, to riding her horse, and to playing basketball with her friends. "From the amazing doctors and nurses to Child Life to the support staff...how can we ever thank all who took such wonderful care of our daughter," says Trish. "We have our funny, sarcastic, creative, and beautiful girl back, thanks to everyone at Nemours."
